Expectations of Stewardship

Steward volunteers are expected to contribute in four key areas: Time, Leadership, Support and Financial. While there are no annual membership dues required, Stewards are expected to contribute a minimum average of 5 hours and \$5 monthly. Stewards donate time, leadership and support through participation in the opportunities offered by the eight Steward Programs and multiple events and other activities.

Steward Programs

Participation in multiple programs and various activities provides a broader range of experience, greater satisfaction, a deeper knowledge, and better understanding and appreciation of the Preserve. Participation through the Conservancy's eight programs enables Stewards to 'give back' in meaningful ways.

CITIZEN SCIENCE

Volunteers participate in research, fieldwork, or program support activities that focus on the Preserve's natural resources.

CONSTRUCTION AND MAINTENANCE

Crews perform trail and trailhead maintenance, land restoration activities, and other work necessary to keep the Preserve open for everyone to enjoy.

EDUCATION

The Conservancy's core education program encompasses the Natural and Human History of the Preserve. It is designed to inform stewards and the general public, and enhance awareness and a greater understanding of the Preserve.

GUIDED HIKE & BIKE

Volunteers serve as leaders or assistants to ensure that visitors can enjoy and learn about the natural resources of the Preserve in a safe manner while hiking or riding mountain bikes.

PASTFINDERS

PastFinders connect the community to the Conservancy and the Preserve by researching, preserving and protecting the historical heritage of the McDowell Mountain region.

PastFinders educate Conservancy Stewards and the public regarding human activities, ancient to modern, through publications, lectures, informational hikes and other appropriate forums.

PATHFINDERS

These trailhead hosts and ambassadors welcome visitors to the Preserve and inform them about its trails, biology and conservation value.

PATROL

Volunteers monitor hundreds of miles on foot, mountain bike, or horseback, providing information about trail conditions for both safety and sustainability.

NATURE GUIDES

Stewards provide the community opportunities to learn about the value, significance, and wonders of the Preserve through interactive tours and trailside learning.

The following outlines the Conservancy's liability and medical coverage responsibility for volunteers.

Liability

A volunteer is included in the definition of "City personnel" within the meaning of a law that protects City of Scottsdale employees from liability. The law provides that "City personnel . . . are immune from suit in courts of the City/State and from liability in tort for a tortious act or omission that is within the scope of the public duties of the City personnel and is made without malice or gross negligence." Thus, the City will represent and defend a volunteer sued for commission of a tortious act provided the volunteer's conduct falls within the stated limitations: the act is committed (a) within the scope of the volunteer's service, (b) without malice, and (c) without gross negligence.

Medical Insurance Coverage

A volunteer worker for a unit of City government is a covered employee under the Arizona Workers' Compensation Act; specifying that, for certain purposes, the City is the employer of a certain volunteer worker; limiting the benefits provided to a volunteer worker to medical services and treatment under Subtitle 6, Part IX for a compensable injury. If a steward is injured in the McDowell Sonoran Preserve while performing assigned duties for the City of Scottsdale, a Notice of Injury report needs to be completed within 24 hours of that injury in order to be covered under the City's workman's compensation.

City of Scottsdale (COS) Volunteer Application

Photo Release
