Amazing Arthropods

What in the world is an arthropod? An arthropod is an invertebrate animal that has an exoskeleton, a segmented body, and paired jointed appendages. Whoa, that's a lot of information! Let's break it down: An arthropod is any animal that does not have a backbone, has a skeleton on the outside of their body (humans have theirs on the inside), has defined body parts (think about the body parts on an ant), and has limbs that bend (like our knees and elbows) Arthropods are EVERYWHERE--they make up over 80% of all known living animals. Join Luke as he hangs out with ants, one type of cool arthropod!

Nicole Kallman, Education Manager


